Friday 14th

Following the opportunity to hear the stories of local tourism experiences and how their businesses have been developed through supports from Fáilte Ireland, it is off to discover how the river boat cruise industry is transitioning away from 'dirty' fuels to much greener alternatives.

Onwards to the city of the tribes, Galway – sitting on the Atlantic it is renowned for its music and maritime history. Enjoy the city by bike before an evening of the finest local seafood and discover why we have so many gin distilleries in Ireland, a county synonymous with whiskey! To round the evening off, there is no better way than to stroll down High Street and enjoy the 'craic' and traditional Irish music in one of Galway's historic pubs.

Saturday 15th

Before heading back to Dublin, a trip west is not complete without seeing the true majesty of the Wild Atlantic Way from the Cliffs of Moher, Europe's tallest sea cliffs.

On the return to Dublin, you will stop off at one of Ireland's castles before enjoying your final night in Malahide, a gorgeous seaside village north of Dublin city and only 15-minutes from the airport. Malahide nestles on the edge of a grand demesne with its own castle and the village will spoil you for choice with restaurants and bars for your final night in Ireland.
